

2 Factor Authentication (2FA)

What is 2 Factor Authentication?

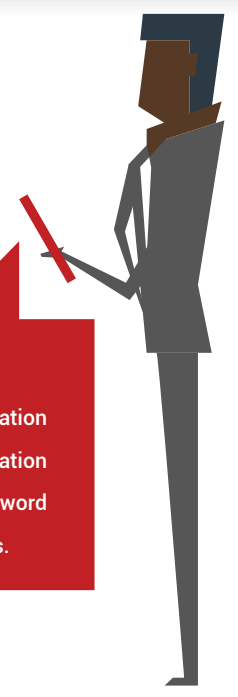
Using two separate forms of identification to verify one's identity is known as two-factor authentication (also known as two-step verification or dual-factor authentication).

In order to use two-factor authentication, a user must provide a password and a second factor, such as a code, in addition to their primary password.

An attacker will have a much harder time getting into an account with two-factor authentication since it makes it more difficult for them to compromise the devices or online accounts of their victims.

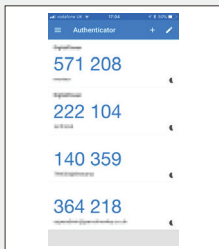
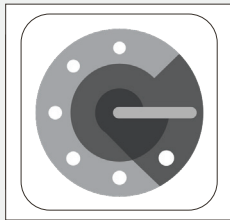
Why 2FA

Every day, bad actors improve the sophistication of their attack routes. Two-factor authentication (2FA) significantly minimizes the risk of password theft, one of the most common attack vectors.

Download App and install onto your smartphone. Get verification codes.

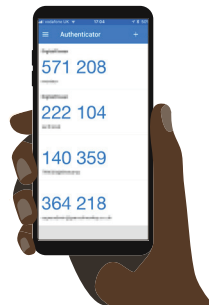

Signing In – How it Works

Step 1

You can **scan the QR Code issued by Insite** on your user profile using the Google Authenticator app once it has been downloaded to your phone.



Step 2

The Google Authenticator will generate a **six-digit numerical code** once this has been scanned and added to your phone.

Step 3

To use the Insite system, you must first log in using your username and password, you then input your one-time code, as shown in the screenshot here.

The user gets authenticated and provided access to the Insite system after supplying both factors.

Open up Google Authenticator app on your phone and enter the code given there for Insite.

If you have not registered Insite with the Google Authenticator app using your QR code yet or have issues with your phone please contact your support representative for a backup code.
